I, Henry Moor late of the County of Oneida and State of New York but now deceased, do, upon oath, testify and declare, that to the best of my knowledge and belief, the said John Moor was a private in Col. Van Schaick's Regiment of Infantry belonging to the New York Line, on Continental establishment, during the Revolutionary War. I do further testify and declare, that I have never received a warrant from the United States for the Quantity of land due the said deceased, testify and declare, that I have never received a warrant from the United States, or the quantity of land due the said deceased, from the United States; nor do I believe that he ever received it, or transferred his right to it in any manner during his life time.

Therefore, know all men by these presents, that I, Henry Moor as aforesaid, do hereby constitute and appoint Gen. S.K. Chamberlain, or Col. Joseph Watson, my true and lawful Attorneys for me, in my name, to demand and receive from the Secretary of War of the United States, for the time being, a warrant for the quantity of land due in right of said deceased. And my said Attorneys I do hereby fully authorize and empower to constitute and appoint, one or more substitutes or Attorneys under them, for the special purpose herein expressed, and the same to revoke at will.
