

## **Pension Application for Samuel Mott**

County of Orange SS.

Be it remembered that on the eighth day of April in the year 1818. Personally appeared before me Joseph Morrell one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Orange Samuel Mott of the town of Newburgh in the County of Orange and who being duly sworn doth depose and say that in the year 1778 he enlisted in the 3<sup>rd</sup> New York Regiment, commanded by Col. Gansvort in a company commanded by Capt. Gregg and served in his company until Capt Gregg was Scalped by the Indians at Fort Stanwix.

He then; was attached to Capt Aaron Austin's Company in the same Regiment—and served about three years when Capt. Austin's Company was attached to the first New York Regiment commanded by Col. VanSchaick in which he continued until he was discharged.

He was discharged at New Windsor on the 8th day of June in the year 1783, & his discharge was signed by General Washington and contained an Honorable Badge of merit.

That he gave his discharge to a man who purchased his pay certificate—

That he is now sixty four years of age—and by reason of his reduced circumstances is in need of assistance from his country for support—and further that he was a corporal in Captain Austin's Company at the time of his discharge. (Signed with his mark) Samuel Mott
