

Pension Application for Thomas Mott

W.16349 (Widow: Polly) Married May 5, 1776. Thomas died June 4, 1813.

Be it known that on the 21st day of April 1827 personally appeared before me the under Signed one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas, in and for said County, Polly Mott, a resident of the Town of Rockland in said County aged 89 year[s], who being first duly sworn, according to law; doth on her oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress, passed July 4th 1836, that she is the widow of Thomas Mott who was a private soldier in the army of the revolutionary war, that she did in the Spring of the year 1778, then residing in the County Westchester in said State, in-listed for three years or during the war, and that he continued in said Levis till peace, and she further declares she was married to the said Thomas Mott on the 5th day of May in the year 1776, that her husband, the said Thomas Mott died on the fourth day of June in the year of 1813— and that she has remained a widow ever since that period as will more fully appear by the proff [proof] hereto annexed and that she has no documentary evidence in support of her said husband , Levis with in her knowledge, and must rely upon the records for the support thereof.
