Pension Application for Walter Munro or Munroe

R.7494 State of New York City and County of New York SS.

On this first day of June eighteen hundred and fourty [forty] three, personally appeared before me, Wm. D. Waterman, Alderman of the 9th Ward of the City of New York, Walter Munro, (coulered) a resident of the City and County, and State of New York, aged eighty three years, who being first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain, the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress passed June 7, 1832.

That he enlisted in the Army of the United States, in the month of September, of the year after Fort Montgomery was taken, with Captain Keesley and served in the [blank] regiment of the Pensylvania [Pennsylvania] line, under the folwing [following] named officers, Col. Malcom, Lieut Col. Burr, Maj. Paulding, Paymaster Oliver, Agt Tallman, Brigade Maj'r Stagg, Captain Keesley, Lieut John Drake, That he was discharged from the service at the cloase [close] of the Revolutionary War, in the month of July of the same year that the Brittish [British] evacuated the City of New York. That at the time he enlisted he resided about two miles below West Point, in the State of New York at which place he enlisted, that he enlisted for during the War.

That he was engaged in no battles, that his regiment, continued at West Point, until in the month of December, when it came down and wintered at Harvestraw, then in the Spring in April, it went to Minnisink when it was transferred to Col. Spencer, of New Jersey, to go after the Indians, and had previously taken him from the ranks for his water, [waiter] in which capacity he served, until the above mentioned time when he was discharged, that he was in service five years lacking about two months, that General Malcom drew his pay and rations for him after he was promoted.

He further declares that he hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or an annuity except the present and he declares that his name is not on the Pension Roll of any Agency in any State. (Signed with his mark) Walter Munro
