

Pension Application for Andrew Murray

W.26282 (Widow: Janet) Married in the winter of seventeen hundred & ninety. Andrew died in 1824.

On this sixteenth day of April on[e] thousand eight hundred and eighteen, before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Albany in the State of New York, personally appears Andrew Murray aged sixty years and upwards resident in the town of Guilderland in the County of Albany and State of New York & who being by me first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled, "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war", that he the said Andrew Murray enlisted in February one thousand seven hundred and seventy six in the City of Albany in the State of New York in the company commanded by Captain Fink of the regiment commanded by Captain Fink of the regiment commanded by Col. VanSchaick, that eh continued to serve in the said corps, or in the service of the United States, until about the first of January one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven, when he was discharged from service in consequence of a wound he received from a musket being accidentally discharged by a blacksmith who as at the time repairing the same at Lake George in the State of New York; and that he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.
