

Pension Application for Teunis Myer

W.18547 (Widow: Cornelia) Teunis died November 22, 1828.

(Couldn't find a deposition by Teunis.)

Washington February 22nd 1844.

Sir

Herewith enclosed is additional proof of the services alledged [alleged] to have been performed by the husband of Cornelia Myer act of 7th July 1838. Which by her declaration she claims for the following services.

Viz 1776 under Moses Cantine Col. Levi Pawlings Regt 5 months.

1776 same year or winter following Capt. [J.L.?] Dewitts Co. [?] 1 Mo.

Spring of 1777 Capt. J. L. Dewitts Col. Fort Montgomery 4 Mo.

1777 fall of the same year Capt. Philip Swart 3 Mo.

Various short tours in the Militia 3 or 4 months period 2 Mo.

1781 Capt Livingston Co., Col Pawlings Regt 7 Mo.

22 Months total.

The first 4 tours of service are conclusively proved by several witnesses who were in the service at the same time, all respectable citizens—personally known to me—the remainder of the services are fully established by the enclosed documents—and for all the above mentioned services she was allowed only \$56.66 per an & for which I now ask an increase.

I have full confidence in the merits of the claim—and will only say that out of a numerous family of Myers of my acquaintance I have never heard of any by the name of Tunis except the husband of the applicant. I have the honor to be very Respectfully your obedient Servant. Henry Wynkoop
