

Pension Application for Kinner Newcomb

W.5405 (Widow: Olive) Kinner died February 6, 1840.

For the purpose of obtaining the benefit of the act entitled, "An act for the relief of certain surviving Officers & soldiers of the [?] of the revolution" approved on the 15th of May 1828, I, Kinner Newcomb of the town of Plattsburgh in the County of Clinton and State of New York do hereby declare that I enlisted in the Continental line of the Army of the Revolution for and during the war and continued with service until it terminated at which period I was a private in Captain Henry Vanderburghs Company in the Second Regiment of the New York line and I [?] declare that I have never received certificate for the reward of Eighty dollars to which I was entitled under a resolve of the Congress passed the 15th day of May A.D. 1776.

And I further declare that I was not on the 15th day of May 1820 on the pension roll of the United States.

I certify that John Palmer one of the persons above named is the District Attorney of the County of Clinton, & that Henry Ostrander made solemn oath before me that he served in the same computer with the said Kinner Newbomb in the Revolutionary War. J.B.L. Kinner, Justice Peace
