Disability

Nicolls, Simon

His name appears on a list of applicants for invalid pension returned by the District Court for the District of New York, submitted to the House of Representatives by the Secretary of War on April 25, 1794, and printed in the American State Papers, class 9, page 94.

Rank: Private

Regt: Colonel Nicholson's (1)

Disability: Had his thigh broken by a baggage wagon going over him, on a march.

When disabled: June 1776. (2)

Residence: Palatine.

Remarks: Not injured, so as to prevent him from laboring. There are no militia rolls in this office.

Evidence transmitted by the District Court incomplete, viz: No evidence of freeholders. Disability from known wounds not proved. No evidence of his leaving the service. No testimony of the continuance of his disability.

End Notes—Simon Nicolls

1. Colonel John Nicholson's Additional Continental Regiment. So far company or regimental muster rolls have not been found for this regiment.
2. The regiment had been at Fort Ticonderoga and eventually was sent to Fort Johnstown and at the Sacondaga. Simon also applied for a pension for his services on April 28, 1818. It was approved and P.A. No. is S.43007
