

**Pension Application for William Oliphant**

W.21868 (Widow: Catharine) Catharine Garner married William Oliphant January 2, 1793. William died October 13, 1831. There doesn't appear to be a deposition by William Oliphant.

Personally appeared before me Samuel Hawley a Justice of the Peace for and in said County of Bennington aforesaid Ephraim Blowers a Resident of the Town of Arlington in said County of Bennington aforesaid; first duly sworn according to law—Deposeth and says I am a soldier of the War of the Revolution I am now a Pensioner of the United States for those services –

I enlisted for during said War & served under Capt. Cornelius J. Johnson and Col VanSchaick for three years & upwards and during this time and service I was acquainted with a fellow soldier named William Oliphant he served in our said Regiment commanded by said Col. VanSchaick –

Her served in the company commanded by Captain Greggs—he was a Dutchman & it was then said he had served during the war—he was discharged when our Regiment was disbanded & discharged –he served under Capt Gregg, Lieutenant Snow & Ensign Willson & Col VanVan Schaick [sic] as aforesaid & served with him or we served together in said Regiment as soldiers together at least three years & upwards as aforesaid I saw said William Oliphant some years after the War in the City of Albany—

He told me he was married and then lived in Schoharie County N.Y. I have not seen him since he was a good honest Dutchman a good true soldier with us. We served 3 years together or over as aforesaid in one Regiment. (Signed with his mark) Ephraim Blowers
