

**Pension Application for Isaac Osterhout**

Isaac Osterhout of Gainsville in the county afd being duly sworn, deposeth and saith, that the deponent was regularly enlisted into a Regiment of Continental Troops commanded by Col. Peter Gansevoort, & served in said Regiments during the expedition against the Seneca Indians under the command of General [blank] Sullivan.

That afterward the Deponent was also enlisted into a Regt of Troops commanded by Col. G. VanSchaick in which Regt the Deponent faithfully served his country against the common enemy until the close of the Revolutionary War, at which time he was honorably discharged.

The Deponent further declares, that the Regiment above mentioned, was known & distinguished as the First New York Regt and that the company in Which the Deponent served, was commanded by Capt Leonard [B?er.]

The Deponent further declares that he is unable to ascertain the exact time of his enlistment, but that he was discharged at the Head Quarters of the American Army, on the 8<sup>th</sup> Day of June AD 1783.

The Deponent further declares that he is a Resident of the United States, and that from his reduced circumstances in life he is in need of assistance from his country for support.
