

**Pension Application for John Out**

John Out of Coxsackie in the said County being duly sworn before me James Mullen a justice of the peace in and for said County:--

Says that he was pressed into the regular service of the United States in the summer of seventeen hundred and seventy five (1775) as a wagoner or teamster with his own team, to draw timber for building barracks for the soldiers in the County of Albany and State of New York; that he served in the capacity of wagoner one month under Captain Putnam; and that from the time and services above mentioned until the taking of General Burgoyne he was enroled [enrolled] and served as a minute man under Capt. Mindert VanSchaick, Lieut. Leonard Bronk and Ensign Jehoiachim Tryon—and that from the taking of Genl Burgoyne in seventeen hundred and seventy seven (1777) until the close of the Revolutionary was he was enrolled and served as a minute man under Captain Mindert VanSchaick, and Lieutenants Leonard Bronk and Richard Vandenberg, and that during this time he was called out a great number of times on scouting parties to fight with and drive back the Indians who were plundering and murdering the white people on our frontiers—and that he had to stand guard one night in each week when he was not away from home on scouting parties and that for all these services he has never received anything from the general government—that he is dependant and in the eighty ninth year of his age and furthermore this deponent saith not.
