

**Pension Application for Mowbray, Mowberry, or Mawberry Owen or Owens**

W.19950 (Widow: Mary) Married March 9, 1784. Mowberry died January 4, 1834.

For the purpose of obtaining the benefit of "An Act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldiers of the Army of the Revolution" approved on the 15<sup>th</sup> of May 1828.

I Mowbray Owen of the town of Ithaca in the County of Tompkins and state of New York do hereby declare that I enlisted in the Continental line of the Army of the Revolution for and during the war & continued in its service until its termination at which period I was a private in Captain Hamtrammocks Company in the Second Regiment of the New York line.

I am uncertain whether I received a Certificate for the reward of Eighty Dollars to which I was entitled under a resolve of Congress passed the fifteenth of May 1778 and I further declare that I was not on the fifteenth day of March 1828 on the pension list of the United States & that at my discharge was sent to the Pension office in Washington several years since. (Signed) Mowbray Owen
