Timothy Baker of said County being duly sworn deposed and saith that he was well acquainted [acquainted] with Michael Parker, 1 that in the winter of 1779 and 1780, he the said Michael Parker and this deponent served in the encampment at Skeensborough now Whitehall, that the s'd Parker at that time served three month sunder Capt. Levi Stockwell, Lieut Thomas Boggs Insign [Ensign] not recollected, and this deponent further saith that his strongest impression is that the said Parker served six months at Fort-Ann previous to its capture, and this deponent further saith that sometime previous to the termination of the revolutionary war (and he thinks previously to the last mentioned service) the said Parker was married to Rachel McWiothy, and further this deponent saith not.
