

Pension Application for Mathias Parr

For the purpose of obtaining the benefit of “An act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldiers of the Army of the Revolution”, approved on the 15th of May 1828. I Mathias Parr of the County of Fayette in the State of Illinois, do hereby declare, that I enlisted in the Continental line of the Army of the Revolution for and during the war, and continued in the service until its termination—at which period I was a private in Capt. Smith’s Company in the second regiment of the New York line, the regiment commanded by Colo. Cortlandt. And I also declare that I did not receive a certificate for the reward of Eighty dollars to which I suppose I was entitled under a resolve of Congress passed the 13th of May 1778, as I was at that time ignorant that I was entitled to such a certificate—

And I further declare that I was not on the 15th day of May 1828 (and still am not) on the pension list of the United States. (Signed) Mathias Parr
