

Pension Application for Joseph Peallar

Montgomery Common Pleas.

On this 14th day of June 1820 personally appeared in open court the said court being a Court of Record within the contemplation of the act of Congress, proceeding according to the principle of common law having the power of fine and imprisonment in the said County Joseph Peallar aged sixty nine years on the 16th day of February last resident in Palatine in said County who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows Viz.

In the year 1775 & 1776 under Captain Andrew Finck[‘s] company, Colonel VanSchaick[‘s] Regiment and New York Line and that at the end of his said two campaigns he was honorably discharged as it mentioned in his original declaration and that the date of his original declaration was the twenty seventh day of April 1818 and the number of his pension certificate is 8,303. And I do solemnly sworn that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the eighteenth day of March 1818 and that I have not since that time by gift sale or any other manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War passed on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property, or securities contracts or debts due to me nor have I any income other that [than] what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed. (Signed with his mark) Joseph Peallar

Real property I have none either in possession, reversion, remainder or expectancy.

Personal property I have none except my necessary Bedding and clothing that I am by occupation a farmer, that I have a wife who is sixty eight years of age and unable to do any work from age, and that we have no support except what I get from this pension and the help of my children and further this deponent saith not.
