

Pension Application for Joseph Peck

S.19023 (Joseph died June 27, 1835.) Surviving children: John Peck; Jesse Peck of Boston Township, Iona County Michigan; Elizabeth Goldtheite, Lydia Stevens of the Twon of Balance, County of Jefferson NY and Deborah Sharp of the Town of Antwerp same count.

For the purpose of obtaining the benefit of “an act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldiers of the arm of the Revolution”, approved on the 15th of May 1828, I, Joseph Peck of Champion County of Jefferson in the State of New York, do hereby declare that I enlisted in the Continental line of the Army of the Revolution, for and during the war, and continued in its service until its termination; at which period I was a private in Captain Thos Patten’s Company of Artillery Artificers, and that the annexed discharge from Genl Washington was given to me at the time it purports to be.

And I also declare that I afterwards received a certificate for the reward of eighty dollars, to which I was entitled, under a resolve of Congress, passed the 15th of May 1778. And I further declare that I was not on the 15th day of March 1818 on the pension list of the United States.
