

Pension Application for Daniel Pepon

W.16363 (Widow: Elizabeth) Daniel died November 12, 1820.

Letter in folder dated January 16, 1940, written in response to an inquiry.

Reference is made to your request for the Revolutionary War record of Daniel Pepon, which information is desired by Mr. Albert Rathbone of 70 Broadway, New York City.

The data which follow were taken from papers on file in the pension claim W.16363, based on the Revolutionary War service of Daniel Pepon.

The date and place of birth of Daniel Pepon and the names of his parents are not shown.

Daniel Pepon enlisted, place not given, and served from June, 1777, until January, 1778, as sergeant in Captain Augustus Collins' company in Colonel John Ely's Connecticut regiment and was in General Spencer's expedition to Rhode Island.

Daniel Pepon married in Canaan, Columbia County, New York, February 17, 1789, Miss Elizabeth (Betsey) James.

He died November 12, 1820, in Stockbridge, Massachusetts.

As the widow of Daniel Pepon, Elizabeth Pepon was allowed pension on her application executed April 29, 1839, at which time she was sixty-eight years of age and was living in Albany, Albany County, New York.

One John F. Jenkins of Albany, New York, stated in 1839 that he has married the daughter of Daniel and Elizabeth Pepon, her name not given.

In 1839, open David Porter, resident of Catskill, Greene County, New York, aged seventy-seven years, stated that he served in the Revolutionary War with Daniel Pepon who was four years his senior and that both were residents of Hebron, Connecticut, when they were boys.

Lemuel Jenkins was living in Albany, New York, in 1839, relationship to the widow not shown.

There are no further data relative to the family of Daniel Pepon.
