

Pension Application for Christopher Queen

On this thirtieth day of May in the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty personally appeared in open court, being a Court of Record, called the Common Pleas Court for the said County of Greene, Christopher Queen aged about sixty years resident in the Town of Catskill in the County of Greene who being first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows in Captain Johnsons Company of Infantry in the Regiment of the Second New York line commanded by Coln VanCortlandt, that the original Declaration of the said Christopher Queen for the benefit of the act entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and navel service of the Unites States in the Revolutionary War" passed on the eighteenth day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, bears date the fifth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighteen to the best of his knowledge & belief, and is inscribed on the pension list Roll of the New York agency by certificate, Number 11, 199.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States, on the Eighteenth day of March in the year one thousand eight hundred eighteen; and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale or in any manner, disposed of my property or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it; as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled "an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War; passed on the 18th day of March 1818, and that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or Debts, due to me, nor have I any other income than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed.

I have no property of any description either real or personal except my necessary wearing apparel. [apparel] (Signed with his mark) Christopher Queen

That my occupation is that of a day Labourer my ability to Labour is impaired by age and infirmity brought on by fits. I have no family. (Signed with his mark) Christopher Queen
