

Pension Application for Christopher Ramser

R.8575 (Widow: Deborah) Christopher Ramser died April 7, 1831.

Letter in folder dated June 19, 1940, written in response to an inquiry.

The data contained herein were obtained from the papers on file in the Revolutionary War pension claim R.8575, based upon the military service in that war of Christopher Ramser.

The date and place of birth and the names of the parents of Christopher Ramser are not shown.

He died April 7, 1831, place not given. His age not stated.

He married November 20, 1774, in Albany, New York, Deborah, her maiden name not given.

Christopher Ramser's widow, Deborah Ramser, applied for pension February 13, 1838, at which time she was a resident of Amsterdam, Montgomery County, New York, and aged eighty-six years. She stated that he husband, Christopher Ramser, enlisted in Lansingburgh, New York, and served on short tours during 1775 and 1776, as private in Captain Christopher Tillman's Company, and that during 1777-1783 inclusive, he served on short tours as private in Captain Matthew DeGarmo's Company, Colonel Peter Yates' New York Regiment.

Her claim for pension was not allowed as she failed to furnish proof of service as required by the pension laws.

In 1838, Peter Ramser, son of Christopher and Deborah Ramser, was living in Amsterdam, New York, his age not shown. There are no further family data.
