

Pension Application for Joseph Randall or Randell

W.24719 (Widow: Judith) They married August 25, 1785. He died February 23, 1822.
Continental (Canadian)
Livingston's private Regim't. New York Line.
Inscribed on the Roll of Vermont.

Letter in folder dated April 5, 1926, written in response to an inquiry.

I have to advise you that from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim W.24719 it appears that Joseph Randall or Randell was born in Canada, date not stated.

In 1775 while a resident of Saitn Tour, Lower Canada he joined Captain Laboteaux' company of American Army at Quebec and was in the battle of Quebec.

He returned home in March and in May 1776 assisted in taking a British frigate. He enlisted at Albany, New York in the fall of 1776 in Captain Louseaux' company, Colonel Livingston's Continental Regiment, served over three years and was at the surrender of Burgoyne, battle of Rhode Island and several skirmishes.

He was allowed pension on his application executed March 31, 1818 while a resident of Huntsburg, Franklin County, Vermont at which time he stated he was aged fifty-seven years. In 1820 he was living in Franklin, Franklin County, Vermont and stated he was aged sixty-six years. He died February 23, 1822 in said Franklin.

Soldier married August 25, 1785 in Lebanon, Grafton County, New Hampshire, Judith Bowen, or Boin. She was allowed pension on her application executed October 18, 1836 while living in Franklin, Vermont aged seventyfour years.

In 1820 soldier referred to his wife's son, and to his children Judith, William, Betsey and Rhoda, their ages twenty-one, seventeen, fifteen and eleven years, but did not designate ages respectively, and stated that he had sons in the war of 1812, one died in that service, their names not given.
