Peter Renway a Revolutionary soldier being duly sworn doth depose and say that in the retreat of the American Army, under the Command of General Montgomery from Canada in the year 1775 he joined the regiment of Col. Hazen, at Chambly as a volunteer, and continued in said Regiment until they arrived at Albany, when he enlisted into Captain Oliver's Company in the Regiment aforesaid for and during the war—and that he actually [actually] served in said Regiment until 1783 in the month of June as he believes, when he was discharged from the service. His term of service having expired by the terms of his enlistment.

And this deponent further saith that he received an honorable discharge.

That tow years afterwards at Quebec he lost his discharge & has never been able to find it.

That he was in the battle at White Plains & New York—and at the surrender of Cornwallis, that he was at the Battle of Brandywine.

And deponent further saith that he was discharged at the time aforesaid at Head Quarters near Albany—that his discharge was signed by Genl Washington. And further deponent saith not. (Signed with this mark) Peter Renway
