

Pension Application for John Requa

S.27367 Born Aug 4, 1731. While in the Regiment of Colonel James Hammond, Company of Gabriel Requa, John sustained a wound January 7, 1781, from a musket ball wound in his left leg while out on a scout at North Castle. From this wound he had to a great measure, a disability from that wound.

Sir:

Replying to your request for information concerning the military record of John Requa, a soldier of the Revolutionary War, you are advised that a John Requa was allowed a pension on June 14, 1786, at which time he was 23 years of age and residing at Philadelphia. He was pensioned for wound received in line of duty. He served in the New York troops, Revolutionary War, as a private under Capt. Requa and Col. Hammond.
