I certify that satisfactory evidence was addressed to me to prove that Jeriah Rhoades late of the Town of New Marlborough County of Ulster & State of New York, was the father and heir at law [?] to Cornelius Rhoades who was a soldier in the Revolutionary War in the New York Militia in Col. Lewis Dubois Regiment, & was killed at the battle of Fort Montgomery.

That the said Jeriah Rhoades the father died after the death of the said Cornelius Rhoades, and left the following his heirs at law to wit.

John Rhoades, Joseph Rhoades, Archibald Rhoades, Zadac Rhoades, Richard Rhoades, Stephen Rhoades, Rebecca Rhodes, & Elijah Rhoades & that they were his only heirs at law.

That since the death of the said Jeriah Rhoades, the said John Rhoades, Archibald Rhoades & Elijan Rhoades, have died leaving the following then heirs at law to wit. John Rhoades, Cornelius Rhoades, Zadoc Rhoades, Hannah Rhoades, Lewis Rhoades & William Rhoades, the heirs of the said John Rhoades deceased, and Smith Rhoades & Matthew Rhoades the children of the said Archibald Rhoades deceased, and Smith Rhoades, Charles Rhoades & Townsend Rhoades the surviving children of the said Elijah Rhoades, deceased & that the above are the only heirs at law of said deceased persons now living.
