W.4574 (Widow: Sarah) Sarah Dickerson married Jacob Rogers on March 25, 1784. Jacob died January 9, 1830.

There is no deposition by Jacob in the folder.

On this 20th day of May 1839, personally appeared before the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the county aforesaid in open court Sarah Rogers a resident of the Township of Warren in the County aforesaid aged sixty nine years, who being duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress, passed July 7th 1835, entitled "An act granting half pay and pensions to certain widows".

That she is the widow of Jacob Rogers who was a private in the army of the Revolutionary War. That her late husband the said Jacob Rogers was drafted in the County of Saratoga in the State of New York to serve nine months in the army of the Revolution—at that time deponent understood and verily believes that the said Jacob Rogers was attached to Capt Grays Company, was stationed at Saratoga, and that he served out the nine months tour for which the levy was made & was regularly discharged.

That the said Jacob Rogers entered the Service in the Spring of the year Seventeen hundred and eighty one.

That she has no documentary evidence in support of the claim.

She further declares that she was married to the said Jacob Rogers on the 25 day of March (1784) in the year seventeen hundred and eighty four, that her husband, the aforesaid Jacob Rogers died on the ninth day of January eighteen and thirty—that she was no married to him prior to his leaving the service, but the marriage took place

previous to the first day of January one thousand seven hundred and ninety-four viz:
at the time above stated. (Signed) Sarah Rogers.
