

Pension Application for Henry Rosakrans

R.9014 (Widow: Susannah) Susannah Moul and Henry Rosakrans married February 14, 1779. He died February 23, 1820.

Henry never applied for a pension on his own behalf. The file contains no deposition for Henry Rosakrans.

1779 February 14th Then was Hendrick Rosankrans and Susanna Moul Married.

1780 April 23th Then was my daughter Mary Bourn.

1782 March 24th then was my daughter Susanna Bourn.

1784 June 24th then was my son Robert Bourn.

1786 February 17th then was my daughter Sary Bourn.

1791 June 21st then was my daughter Catharine Bourn.

1793 July 6th Then was my son Philips Bourn.

1796 July 6th Then was my son Frederick Bourn.

1798 July 21st then was my son Joshua Bourn.

1799 October 11, then died my son Philip

1820 February 22th Then Hendrick Rosakranse Departed this life.

1822 May 10th then Frederick Rosakrans Departed this life .

1830 January 25th Then Mary Lawrence died.

On this 27th day of September 1839 personally appeared before the undersigned one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas In and for said County aforesaid Susanna Rosakranse a resident of the Town of Rochester in said County aged seventy nine years last March.

Who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefits of the provision of the Act of Congress passed July 4, 1836.

That she is the widow of Henry Rosakranse who was a Sergt in the War of the Revolution. That as she has been informed and believes to be true. That her husband the said Henry Rosekranse resided in the Town of Rochester in said County 1776 and went into the service under Capt. Schoonmaker in Col. Hornbeck Regt and in 1777, was at the North at the Taken [taking] of Burgoyne and continued to service under different officers untill the end of the war. But is unable to give the officers names under whom he served. And that she has not documentary evidence in her possession of her said husbands services but must rely on the records and such serving witness she may be able to procure.

She further declares that she was married to her said Husband Henry Rosakranse on the 14th day of February 1779 in the town of Shawangunk In said County by the Reverend VanNess Pastor of the Dutch Reformed Church in said town and county.

That her name before marriage was Susannah Moul at the time of her marriage she resided in the town of Shawangunk in said County aforesaid and that her

husband Henry Rosakranse died on the 23d day of February 1820 and that she has not intermarried since the death of her said husband Henry Rosakranse as will more fully appear by proof hereunto annexed. Sworn to and subscribed before me the day and year above written. (Signed) Henry Rosakrans)

On this 27th day of September 1839 personally appeared before me Jacob J. Rosa [?] a Justice of the peace in and for said County Cornelius Quick a Resident of the Town of Rochester County and State aforesaid age eighty two years last April who being duly sworn according to Law says on his Oath that he was well acquainted with the Late Henry Rosakrans deceased who was a soldier at Fort Montgomery and there saw the said Henry Rosakrans doing duty as soldier & he thinks in Captain John Hasbrouck's Company and further says on his oath that in Year 1777 in the fall of the year that this deponent was acting as a soldier under Captain Benjamin Kortright at the taking of Burgoine and there saw Henry Rosekrans doing the duty of a soldier he thinks under Captain Benjamin Koartright or Captain Charles Brodhead but well recollects of seeing him doing duty as a soldier under Capt. Schoonmaker on the Western Frontiers and further says not. (Signed) Cornelius Quick
