

Pension Application for Joseph Savage

W.18993 (Widow: Catharine H.) Married Dec. 1, 1793. Joseph died January 15 1814.

B.L.Wt.1928-300 Capt. Of Artillery

Issued Mar 21, 1791.

Letter in folder dated August 23, 1929 written in response to an inquiry. Since Joseph died before the first pension was passed in 1818, here is no deposition for him in the folder.

I advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, W.18993, it appears that Joseph Savage served as a Captain Lieutenant in Colonel Lamb's Regiment of Artillery from January 1, 1777 until December 31, 1779, and as Captain in said Regiment from January 1, 1790 until December 31, 1780.

He afterward served in the United States Army until sometime in 1791.

The place of his resident when he entered the service was not given.

On account of his service in the Revolution, Warrant No. 1928 for three hundred acres of bounty land was issued March 21, 1791.

He died January 15, 1814.

The soldier married, December 1, 1793, in Berwick, Main District, Catharine Hubbard of that place.

She was allowed pension on her application executed July 31, 1838, at which time she was seventy-one years of age and was living in Essex County, Massachusetts, she was a resident of that place in 1843.
