

Pension Application for Daniel Searing

Letter in folder dated August 8, 1906, written in reply to an inquiry.

In reply to your letter dated the 19th ultimo, received the 21st, you are advised that in the papers in claim, Rej. File 9343, it is alleged by the heirs of Daniel Searing that he enlisted when about seventeen or eighteen years old, as a Teamster; was in the battle of White Plains after which he served more than two years as a Private and was one of General Washington's bodyguard at the battle of Trenton. As the soldier himself died without filing a claim, and there is no definite description or proof of service, no pension was allowed on account of the service of Daniel Searing.
