Disability of James See

See, James

His name appears on a list of applicants for invalid pension returned by the District Court for the District of New York, submitted to the House of Representatives by the Secretary of War on May 22, 1794, and printed in the American State Papers, Class 9, Page 126.

Rank: Sergeant

Regt: Colonel James Harman

Disability: Inflammation caused by hurting his left leg by a fall out of bed in a fit of delirium, when he had the smallpox, in captivity, in the Sugar House, New York.

When and where disabled: 1779. New York

Residence: Mount Pleasant, West Chester.

Remarks: No rolls of the regiment of militia in the office.

Evidence incomplete, disability not proved to have been the effect of known wounds.
