

### **Pension Application for John Seger**

Letter written May 21, 1936, written in reply to a request for information.

I have to advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim S.23413, it appears that John Seger was born November 30, 1754, place not stated.

He enlisted at Albany, New York in July 1776 and served five months as a private in Captain John Williams' Company, Colonel Bailey's New York Regiment.

He enlisted in January 1777 and served nine months under Captain John Hun or Hunn in the Quartermaster Department, and transported ammunition and provision from Albany to Fort Edward and other places.

He served several short tours in the Militia, no details given.

He was allowed pension on his application executed September 18, 1832, while a resident of Guilderland, Albany County, New York.

In 1841, he was residing in Albany, New York.

It is not stated that soldier was married.
