

### **Pension Application for George Sinclair**

Letter dated January 13, 1937.

Reference is made to your letter in which you furnish further information in regard to George Sinclair, a soldier of the Revolutionary War who served from New York and in 1801, was living in New York City.

The data which follow are obtained from the papers on file in Revolutionary War pension claim, S.43143, based upon the military service in that war of George Sinclair, the only soldier of that name or similar spelling, who applied for pension while residing in the state of New York, that is found on the Revolutionary War records of this office. It is hoped that this record will be of assistance to you in your research.

The date and place of birth and the names of the parents of George Sinclair are not shown.

George Sinclair enlisted, place not stated in December 1779, served as a private in Captain John Doughty's Company, Colonel John Lamb's Regiment and was discharged in July 1783.

He was allowed pension on his application executed March 24, 1818, while residing in Albany, Albany County, New York.

There are no data as to soldier's family.
