

Pension Application for Isaac Smith

Isaac Smith of the Town of Brookhaven in the County of Suffolk aged about sixty nine years being duly sworn doth depose and say that he the said Isaac Smith enlisted in the said Town of Brookhaven in the State of New York some time in the month of March in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy six in the company commanded by Capt. Daniel Griffing in Regiment commanded by Coll Henry B. Livingston in the New York line for the term of nine months that he served in said Company during nine months and at the expiration of said nine months the said deponent sayeth that at the particular request of General James Clinton he continued to serve for the term of three months. When he was regularly discharged at Fort Mongomery [Montgomery] in the State of New York which discharge this deponent has lost that he was in the expedition of the Capture of Cap Jacob Smith and his company at N. Talbet in said Town of Brookhaven. That he the deponent is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of his country for support and this deponent further sayeth that he has never had any pension heretofore by the laws of the United States except that which he may be entitled to under the late act of Congress entitled and [an] act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service in the Revolutionary War.
