

### Pension Application for Jacobus Smith

Jefferson County SS.

On this 11 day of September 1832, personally appeared in open Court, before the Judges of the court of Common Pleas, in and for said County, now sitting, Jacobus Smith a resident of Pamela in said County, aged 67 7/12 years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress, passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers, and served as herein stated. At Marbletown Ulster Co. N. York, April 1, 1782 enlisted for nine months in Capt. Pauling's Co'y, Colo Frederic Wysesfet Regt, New York State Troops a private—was stationed at Marbletown and was the Colonel's guard the whole time of service and was discharged at Marbletown at the expiration of the nine months. Know of no witness, but Major Thomas Delano whose affidavit is hereto attached, has no documentary evidence no discharge in writing—was born in Marbletown —10 years in Springfield Otsego County and now in Pamela where I have lived the last nine years—and further that there is no clergyman in the vicinity where he resides.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a Pension or Annuity except the present; and declares that his name is not on the Pension Roll of the Agency of any State. (Signed) Jacobus Smith
