

### Disability for John Smith

Smith, John

His name appears on a list of claimants to be placed on the pension list returned by the District Court for the District of Connecticut, submitted to the House of Representatives by the Secretary of War on April 25, 1794, and printed in the American State Papers, class 9, page 112.

Rank: Private

Regt: Col. M. Willett's

Disability: Lost the toes of his feet by severe frost.

When disabled: February, 1783.

Resident: Bristol.

Monthly allowance: \$2.96.

Arrearages: \$100.

Remarks: This man was in this regiment in 1793.

Smith, John

His name appears on a list of invalid pensioners returned by the Circuit Court for the district of Connecticut, submitted to the House of Representatives by the Secretary of War on Dec. 14, 1792 [this must mean 1792], and printed in the American State Papers, Class 9, page 61.

Rank: Private

Regt: Col. M. Willett's

Disability: Badly frozen in his feet, upon a tedious march from Oswego to Fort Rensselaer, on the Mohawk River in February, 1783.

Date of commencement: May 3, 1792

Monthly allowance \$2.52.

Arrears due: \$100.00
