

Bounty Land File for Amos Sniffing or Kniffen or Kniffing

B.L.Wt. 7728, issued 1790

This folder contains a discharge signed by George Washington. *“These are to certify that the bearer hereof Amos Sniffing private in the Second N.York Regiment, having faithfully served the United States six years and six months and being enlisted for the war only, is hereby discharged from the American Army. Head-Quarters, June 8th 1783. The within certificate shall not avail the Bearer as a Discharge, until the Ratification of the definitive Treaty of Peace; previous to which Time, and until Proclamation thereof shall be made, He is to be considered as being on Furlough. George Washington.”*

The record show that Private Amos Sniffen or Kniffin of the New York Line, warrant Number 7728, was awarded 100 acres, issued August 12, 1790, to Benj. Coe, assignee
