

Pension Application for Lewis or Lodowick, Ludwig Snyder

R.9923 (Widow: Lucy. Married in the year 1774, Town of Duanesburg) Lewis died in 1817. Lucy died June 22, 1850. They had five surviving children, George, Jacob, Michael, Philip L., and Cady Bohall.

Letter in folder dated April 6, 1929. This is about the best record of the service performed by Lewis, the depositions by Lucy and son are not concise. The claim was denied.

I advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, R.9923, it appears that Lewis or Lodowick or Ludwig Snyder was a native of Duanesburg, Schenectady County, New York, the date of his birth is not given, and resided there during the War of the Revolution. He died, July 28, 1817, aged sixty-seven years.

Lewis or Lodowick or Ludwig Snyder married in 1774 in Duanesburg, New York, Lucy, her maiden name is not stated. She died, June 22, 1850.

Their son, George Snyder, while residing in Warsaw, Wyoming County, New York, applied, October 23, 1850, for a pension that might have been due his mother and stated that his father served in the New York Militia at various time during the War of the Revolution, a part of the time under Captain Dirtz or Dietz and Colonel Vrooman, he have no dates of service.

The claim was not allowed as he did not furnish proof of service as required by the pension law.
