John Hammond of Middletown in the County Delaware being duly sworn deposeth and saith that he is personally well acquainted with Abraham VanSteenburgh of New Durham in the County of Green[e] and hath been well acquainted with him ever since the last of May or first of June in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven, in which year this deponent became acquainted with him as a soldier inlisted [sic] in Captain Waltun's Company and Coll Henry B. Livingston's Regiment of United States Troops in the Line of the State of New York at which time this deponent was inlisted and served in Capt. Cornelius Jansen's Company and Coll Gansevoort's Regiment of United States Troops in the Line of the State of New York and was with him at the taking of Gen. Burgoine and in the Campaign of General Sullivan against the Indians and that this deponent personally knows that the said Abraham VanSteenbergh hath served upwards of nine months and for two whole campaigns in the army of the Revolution and further saith not.
