

### Pension Application for Piere Suba

Revolutionary Claims. Treasury Department, 7 Oct 1831.

Piere Suba of Plattsburgh in the County of Clinton in the State of N.Y. has applied to the Secretary of the Treasury for the benefits of the act, entitled "An act for the relief of certain surviving officers and soldiers of the Revolution," approved the 15<sup>th</sup> of May, 1828. He states that he enlisted in the Continental line of the army of the Revolution, for and during the war, and continued until its termination, at which period he was Private in Captain Olivea's company in Col. Hazen's Regiment of the [blank] line; and that he received a certificate for the reward of eighty dollars, provided by the resolve of the 15<sup>th</sup> of May, 1778; and further, that he was not on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of May, 1828, on the pension list of the United States, and that he has received as a pensioner since the 3d of March 1826, nothing.

The Third Auditor is requested to report how far the several statements are corroborated by the records in his office. By order of the Secretary. F. A. Dickins.

It further appears that Piere Suba is not on the pension list of any agency, and has not been so since the 3d March 1826.

The name of Piere Suba cannot be found among those of Colo. Hazen's Regiment to whom certificates for the gratuity of eighty dollars, were issued. (Signed) Peter Hagner, Aud.

War Dept Bounty Land Office. Oct. 11<sup>th</sup> 1831.

The name of Piere Suba is not returned on the Records of Hazen's Regt on file in this office as entitled to bounty land from the U. States, nor has a Land Warrant ever issued in his name. Wm. Gordon.

War Dept. Pension Office. Oct 13, 1831.

The name of Piere Suba appears on the Rolls of service of Col. Hazen's Regt as having enlisted 24 Febry 1778, discharged 6 May 1780. Banj. L. Buell. 2 Clk.

The undersigned herewith sends to the department his declaration under the act of Congress entitled "an act for the relief of certain officers and soldier of the Revolution" approved 15<sup>th</sup> May 1828 to entitle him to be placed on the Pension list of the United States.

As the undersigned can neither read nor write and is thereby liable to imposition he respectfully requests the Secretary of the Treasury to make all communications on this subject to St. John B. L. For the purpose of obtaining the benefits of the Act entitled "An Act for the relief of certain Surviving officers and Soldiers of the army of the Revolution: approved on the 15<sup>th</sup> of May 1828 I, Piere Suba of Plattsburgh in the County Clinton and State of New York, do hereby declare that I enlisted in the Continental line of the Army of the Revolution for and during the war and continued in the service until its termination at which period I was a private in Captain Olivea's Company in Col. Hazen's Regiment. And I also declare that I afterwards received certificates for the rewards of eighty dollars to which I was entitled under a resolve of Congress passed 15<sup>th</sup> May 1778.

And I further declare that I was not on the fifteenth day of May 1828 on the Pension List of the United States.

Witness my hand this 16<sup>th</sup> day of September 1831, in presence of St. J. B.L. Skinner (Signed with his mark) Piere Suba.

Before me St. John B.L. Skinner a Justice of the Peace in and for the County of Clinton in the State of New York personally appeared this day Alexander Terriol & Bazil Nadau of the said County who did severally make oath that Piere Suba by whom the foregoing declaration was subscribed is generally reputed and believed to have been a soldier in the army of the Revolution in manner as therein stated.
