I acknowledge the receipt from the War Department a Land warrant No. 1740 for one hundred acres of land issued in the name of Morrison Taylor son and the other heirs at Law of John Taylor who was a private soldier in the New York Line. George W. Howell Atty for Morrison Taylor

I do hereby certify that satisfactory evidence was adduced to me by the oath of peter Davis of orange County New York who was a soldier in the New York line In the war of the Revolution and at this time a United States Pensioner that he was well acquainted with John Taylor while in the United States army in Lamb's Artillery New York line in the war of the Revolution.

Also by the oath of John Wilson of Orange County that he was well acquainted with the above named John Taylor that he died in the Town of Walkill Orange County and State aforesaid on or about the 12 day of April 1820 and that he lived a near neighbor to him, that is, within less than a quarter of a mile for twenty years and upwards that he never knew or understood from him or any of his family that he was a pensioner at anytime or in any way whatsoever.
