

Pension Application for Adam TenBroeck

W.11614 (Widow: Hannah) They married January 28, 1807. Adam died May 30, 1826. B.L.Wt.2190-150- Ensign. Issued Dec 9, 1791 to Peter P. Rockefeller. Name spelled TenBrook. No papers.

Adam TenBroeck of the Town of Claverack in the County of Columbia and State of New York being duly sworn maketh oath and saith, that he entered the army of the United States on the twenty ninth day of June in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty one, as an ensign in the company commanded by Captain John C. TenBroeck, which company was attached to the Regiment commanded by Colonel Goesa VanSchaack in the New York Line, that this deponent continued to serve in said company and regiment from the said twenty ninth day of June in the year aforesaid untill the end of the war that he is the person named In the annexed commission and received the same in the month of June one thousand seven hundred and eighty three by which he took rank as an ensign from the time of his entering the service as major, to wit, the twenty ninth day of June one thousand seven hundred and eighty one that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of assistance from his country for support. (Signed) Adam Ten Broeck

Sworn the 1st day of April 1818 before me. Jos. D. Monell, Recorder of Hudson and one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas called the Mayors Court of the City of Hudson.

In a deposition dated February 20, 1821 he lists his occupation as a farmer, aged 64 and greatly troubled with rheumatic affections and infirmities. Wife Hannah aged 46, Eliza aged eleven, Abraham aged 17, Catharine aged 9, Jane aged 5, Ledia aged 4 and James aged 1 and some months.
