

Pension Application for Joseph TenEyck or Tenycke or Tenyke

On this twenty-first day of May 1818 before me the Subscriber, the first Judge of the County of Rockland, Personally appears Joseph Teneyck aged fifty four years resident in the County of Orange in said district, who being by me first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the Provision made by the late Act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War. That he the said Joseph Teneyck enlisted in Haverstraw County of Orange in the State of New York in the Company commanded by Captain Amos Hutchins of the Second Regiment New York Line. That he continued to serve in the said corps or in the Service of the United States until the close of the war. When he was discharged from service in the County of Orange State of New York. That he was in the battle at Fort Montgomery and taken prisoner was exchanged and joined the United States Army at White Plains, went on the Western expedition under General Sullivan was at the taking of Cornwallis at York Town and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of assistance of his country for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.
