

Pension Application for Robert Thomas

Be it remembered that on the first day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen appeared before me Thomas Dibble one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Saratoga & State of New York, Robert Thomas, of the town of Malta in the County of Saratoga aforesaid who being by me Thomas Dibble one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Saratoga State of New York Robert Thomas of the town of Malta in the County of Saratoga aforesaid who being by me duly sworn declared that he served in the war of the Revolution against the common enemy.

That he enlisted at Catskill in the State of New York in a company commanded by Captain Samuel VanVechten in a Regiment commanded by Col. Wynekoop in New York State troops in the Spring of the year 1776 for the term of nine months. That he served the said nine months faithfully and was discharged in the winter of the year 1777.

And in the same winter 1777 he enlisted at Whitehall in the said State in Captain Burroughs company in Colonel Seth Warner's Regiment for the term of three years & was afterwards transferred to Captain Simeon Smith's Company in the same Regiment, that he served the term of three years faithfully & received an honorable discharge.

That afterwards he volunteered in the Militia was taken prisoner in the North part of the State of New York & remained a prisoner for three years & till the conclusion of the war that he is now about Sixty years of age & in very indigent circumstances & in need of assistance for his support.
