

**Pension Application for James Thomson**

On this twenty sixth day of April 1818 before me the subscriber, one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas of the county and state aforesaid. Personally appears James Thomson aged sixty three years, resident in Constable in the said county and state, who being by me first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war:"

That the said Ja's Thomson in March or April 1780 enlisted in Stillwater in the State of New York in the company commanded by Captain Job Wright of the Regt Commanded by Colonel Marinus Willet, that he continued to serve in the said corps, or in the service of the United States until the Sixth of January AD 1783, when he was discharged from service in Schenectady state of New York; that he was in the battles of German Flatts & frequent other skirmishes along the Mohawk, and that he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services.
