

Pension Application for Daniel Thurston

W.22410 (Widow: Charlotte) Charlotte Mudge and Daniel Thurston married February 20, 1786. He died November 29, 1824.

This file does not contain a deposition for Daniel.

Letter in folder dates October 6, 1925, written in response to an inquiry.

I have to advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim, W.22410, it appears that Daniel Thurson enlisted at Canaan, New York in April 1782 and served as a private in Captains Silas Gray's and Joseph Harrison's Companies, Colonel Willett's New York Regiment and was discharged by Captain Peter B. Tearse, January 6, 1784.

He died November 29, 1824, in Busti, Cattaraugus County, New York.

Soldier married February 20, 1786 at New Lebanon, Columbia County, New York, Charlotte Mudge. She was allowed pension on her application executed August 15, 1839, while a resident of Geneva, Ontariou County, New York, aged seventy-one years.

Their oldest child was born February 14, 1784, no name stated.

Daughters, Lydia A. Clement, aged thirty-five years in 1839, was living in Geneva, New York; and Elizabeth Croshaw, was also living in said Geneva in 1839. There is onto further data on file relative to their children.

A son-in-law, George Croshaw, is referred to in 1839,
