

Pension Application for Silvanus Travis

Letter in folder dated April 20, 1937, written in response to an inquiry.

You are furnished herein the record of Silvanus Travis, as found in pension claim, S.46509, based upon his service in the Revolutionary War.

The date and place of birth and names of parents of Silvanus Travis are not given. He was brought up in Frederickstown which was later known as Carmel, then in Dutchess County, New York.

While a resident of Frederickstown, New York, Silvanus Travis enlisted, date not stated, for the Revolutionary War, served as a private in Colonel Hazen's Regiment, and in Captain Moddie's company, Colonel Lamb's 2nd Regiment of Artillery, and was discharged at West Point at the close of; the war, length of service not stated.

Silvanus Travis was allowed pension on his application executed October 6, 1828, at which time he was a resident of Lodi, Seneca County, New York. He signed Silvanus but was pensioned Sylvanus Travis. His age was not given. In 1829, his post-office address was Trumansburg, Tompkins county, New York, in care of H.D. Barto. The soldier died February 1, 1842. The soldier died Febraury 1, 1842.

No reference was made in the claim to wife or children of the soldier.

In 1828, one Cornelius L. Travis was a resident of Lodi, New York, no relationship shown to soldier.
