

Pension Application for Absalom or Absolem Trowbridge

Personally came before me Lewis Condict one of the Judges of the Inferior Court of Common Pleas in and for the said County of Morris, Absolem Trowbridge, who being duly sworn according to law, deposeth and saith, that he served as a private soldier in the service of the United States against the common enemy in the Revolutionary War. That he enlisted some time in the month of May of the year seventeen hundred and seventy eight at Little Nine Partners in the State of New York, in Lieutenant Livingstons Company of the second Regiment of the New York Line commanded by Col. Courtlandt's Frederick Weisenfelt being the Lieut Col. That he continued in the said Regiment on the Continental establishment the full term of nine months; that he was discharged by a regular discharge at Warwassing [Wawarsing] in the State of New York. That he is the same Absolem Trobridge [Trowbridge] who received the annexed discharge signed by Fred. Weisenfelt Lt. Col.

This Deponent further saith that he resides in the Township of Randolph in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey. That he is about sixty seven years of age, that he has never heretofore received any pension from the United States, and that from his reduced circumstances, he needs the assistance of his Country for support, and prays to have his name placed on the pension List under the Act of Congress passed in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War.”
