

Pension Application for William Tuthill

On this 15th day of June 1820 personally appeared in open court it being a Court of Record for said County William Tuthill aged fifty eight years resident in the town of Oxford In said County who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in the revolutionary war as follows.

I enlisted under the command of Captain Newkirk in Col. Cortland's Regiment in the New York line and served as a soldier in said Regiment about three years and a half and was at the time taking taking of Cornwallis and the date of my declaration was the twenty first day of May 1818 & the number of my certificate is 13539 and I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen [citizen] of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 & that I have not since that time by gift, sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provision of tan act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land & naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war passed on the 18th day of March 1818 & that I have not nor has any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due me or have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed & by me subscribed viz 1 broad axe \$2.50, 1 saw \$2, 1 plain \$.50, chisel 75 cents.

I have no other property neither real nor personal my occupation is a carpenter but very infirm & have been such & supported by the county as a county pauper the pension that I now draw and what I can labour gives me support. I never had any family but have resided in Oxford for about 24 years signed & lsubscribed to this fifteenth day of June 1820. (Signed) William Tuthill
