

**Pension Application for Nathan Upright**

W.20099 (Widow: Mary) Married January 20, 1793. He died February 3, 1831.

State of New York

Ulster County SS.

On this twentieth day of April 1818 before me the Subscriber one of the Judges of the court of Common Pleas in & for the County of Ulster in the State of New York personally appears Nathan Upright aged Fifty Seven years resident in the town of Shawangunk in the said County of Ulster who being by me first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provisions made by the late act of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land & Naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War.

That the said Nathan Upright enlisted at Ramapo in New Jersey in the company commanded by Capt. Cornelius S. Jansen in the 3<sup>rd</sup> New York Regiment commanded by Col. Peter Gansevoort in the month of February about the 16<sup>th</sup> in the year 1777. That he continued to serve in the said corps until the 16<sup>th</sup> day of February 1780 when he was discharged from service at MorrisTown in the State of New Jersey at which time he received his discharge from Col. Gansevoort which he hath since lost.

That he was at the Battles of Peekskill, Fort Stanwix and with the Detachment commanded by General Sullivan sent against the Indians and that he is in reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support. (Signed with his mark) Nathan Upright.
