

**Pension Application for Myndert Vandebogart or Vandenbogart or Vanderbogart**

Declaration. In order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress, passed June 7, 1832.

On this twenty fifth day of July 1832 personally appeared before the Justices Court of the city of Albany, in open court, Myndert Vandebogart, a resident of Alms house in the City of Albany in the county of Albany and state of New York aged on the first Feby next seventy seven years, who being first duly sworn, according to law, doth on his oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress, passed June 7<sup>th</sup>, 1832.

That he enlisted in the army of the United States in the year 1776, with Capt Andrew Billings in the Village of Poughkeepsie and served in the third New York regiment of the line, under the following named officers; Col. Ritzman was the first Colonel, who, as this Declarer has been informed and believes, afterwards deserted, whereupon the command of the Regiment devolved on Lieut. Col. Frederick Wisenfels and served faithfully for one year.—That in the year 1777 he enlisted again for nine months under Capt Elijah Herrick, and in Col Graham's regiment in Poughkeepsie aforesaid, and marched to Peramus to the southward, and returned from thence to Poughkeepsie, where after a short stay, he marched with the Regiment to VanSchaick's Island up the river above Albany, and from thence to Bemus's heights, where Burgoine & his army then lay, and that this Declarer was in the battles of the [?] Sept and 2d October with the army, and that the declarer was with the brigade after his surrender, and which guard'd the prisoners on their way down to Albany the third time he enlisted again at Poughkeepsie for nine months under Capt Charles Newkirk of Col Van Cortlandts Regiment and marched form Poughkeepsie to Valley Forge, and from thence to Monmouth and was [?]

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or an annuity, except the present, and he declares that his name is not on the pension roll of any agency in any state. (Signed with his mark) Myndert Vandenbogart
