On the ninth day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and nineteen before me the subscriber one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the County of Green and State of New York personally appeared John Vandeburgh—Resident of the Town of Lexington in the County of Green and State of New York aged sixty six years who being by me first duly sworn in order to obtain the provisions made by the late act of Congress Intitled [entitled] an act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land and naval service of the United States In the revolutionary war. That the said John vAndeburgh Inlisted on the first day of April in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy six Inlisted for one year Inlisted at a place called Rhynebush flatts in the State of New York Inlisted in the company Commanded by Captain Childs in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Henry Livingston in the York line that he continued to serve in said Corps untill the first of January one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven at which time many of the men Inlsited out of the Company for three years and during the war but that he Continued to serve in said Corps until the year expired on the Eleventh of March in the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven he received his discharge at fort Mongomery [Montgomery] in the State of New York by his Excellency James Clinton Brigadier General and that he is now in reduced Circumstances and stands in need of the assistance of his Country for support and has no other evidence now in his power of his service but such as accompanys these proceedings.
