

Bounty Land for Isaac Van Guilder, or Van Gelder

The data which follow in regard to Isaac Van Guilder (name shown Van Gelder, also) were obtained from the claim for bounty land based upon his service in the Revolutionary War.

The date and place of birth of Isaac Van Guilder and names of his parents are not shown.

Isaac Van Guilder enlisted in 1777, place not stated, to serve during the war, served as private in Colonel Philip VanCortlandt's 2nd New York Regiment, and continued in service until the close of the Revolutionary War.

James Van Guilder, son of Isaac, applied February 24, 1830, in Orange County, New York, for bounty land which was due on account of the soldier's service. He applied in behalf of himself and the other heirs at law of Isaac Van Guilder (their names not designated).

The records show that Warrant No. 1658, for one hundred acres of bounty land, was issued July 16, 1830, to James Van Guilder and the other heirs at law of Isaac Van Guilder, deceased.
